### Packing List

1. Lambs, pigs, **AND STEERS will need to provide their own bedding.** Shavings or bark is recommended, steers can use straw in tie outs. **NO BEDDING WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR SALE ON THE GROUNDS.**
2. All out of state livestock must have health papers. Lambs will be provided.
3. Campers should bring the necessary equipment for your specie listed on the website. (Except those flying in)
4. A livestock show supply trailer will be on site handling lamb, pig, and steer show supplies for sale.
5. **STEERS/HEIFERS** must have **BOTH** a halter and neck tie for stalling and security purposes.
6. Extension cords, hoses, nozzles, soaps, towels, wash bibs/pants, boots, etc.
7. Work clothes, show clothes, casual clothes, several pair of shoes.
8. Bedding for dorms (bunk beds), shower items, towels, toiletries.
9. Refer to website section “What to Bring” under each specie icon for livestock equipment list.

### Arriving

1. Campers should arrive between 3:00 and 5:00 pm on May 9<sup>th</sup>. Campers should be checked in, moved in the dorms, have livestock and equipment moved in and set up, and be ready to begin promptly at 6:00 pm.
2. Camp will conclude on Sunday at 2 pm. (Itineraries for each specie available upon arrival)
3. Use 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue from I-71. Lambs, and pigs will be stalled in the O’Neil Building and steers will be stall at the Viaduct tie-outs.

4. Campers will be staying in the Rhoades Center Dorms.
5. Trailers must park behind the Viaduct or in the North Lot across 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
6. Daily vehicle admission to the grounds is \$4.00 each entry or \$12 event pass purchased at the gate.

#### Paperwork

1. ALL campers and spectators MUST have liability forms on file.
2. All persons staying as spectators MUST be enrolled as a supportive spectator (\$95). No exceptions. Meal tickets will be available for those not participating, but wishing to eat with their camper.

#### Camping

1. Those camping will set up across 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue at \$22 per day or current rate established at Korbel Campground.
